Jesus Provides for His Sheep (Psalm 23)

- ▶ Important!!!! A sheep cannot work for his worth!!!!
- The idea of working for God's blessings or our identification should forever die in our heart, but sadly...
- We somehow confused God with Santa Claus, "He's making a list, checking it twice, gonna find out who's naughty and nice..." (thankfully not in the Bible)
- No matter you think you are "naughty" or "nice", He has lay down His life for you. That IS your value. Your service has great worth, but that is NOT your true value

Jesus Protects His Sheep

► God does not want us to live in a state of fear because He wants us to enjoy His daily presence with Him (Psalm 27:1-4)



- Thieves can be **scary** (v.10) worse, they want to **define** us. Thankfully God is greater, and our identity is in Him
- ► (Psalm 23:5) this make no sense, unless you understand that that God's provision is our protection.
- Psalm 23:6) It is **goodness** and **mercy** that will follow you, not an enemy-free life. If we focus on God's mercy and grace, we will grow behind His shield. (Isa. 43:1-7)

Jesus Preserves His Sheep

- No one can remove us from God's hand (John 10:28), or His love (Rom. 8:38-39)
- He will **finish** what he has started (Phil 1:6) & we are His **workmanship** (Eph. 2:10)
- ▶ **Preservation** is one of God's attributes. He preserves His word (Psalm 12:6-7), His works (Col. 1:16-17), and also His people (Heb. 13:20), a main theme in the Bible.
- ► Just because someone walks away from God and he thinks his God will walk away from him, he has sorely misjudge the God of Abraham (Eze. 33:10-11, ill: Ahab)



Good Shepherd Is Still Seeking...

- If Jesus would **provide** for us, **protect** us, and **preserve** us always, what does that mean to our everyday lives?
- (v.24-31) They cannot accept Jesus' **identity** as their shepherd if they could not accept their identity as **sheep**
- ► Can you accept your full **reliance** on the Good Shepherd?
- Note: <u>responsibility</u> is not reliance. We are still responsible of what we **sow**, but we have no power of the **growth** of what we sow. Therefore we must fully rely on God as our shepherd to guide us.
- ► And He is still **seeking** His sheep today...will you respond?
