No False Witness 9th Commandment

EXODUS 20:16

The Original Intent

- This commandment is primarily referring to bearing witness in a **legal** or judicial proceeding. (Deut. 19:15-19) God demands a fair and just justice system for His people, i.e. **government**
- (1 Kings 21:1-16) Bearing false witness could be a very **serious** thing in those days (ill: Stephen, Acts 6:13). Still is serious in our days. (i.e. Twitter)
- Of course there is also a broader intent of this commandment as well (in both OT and NT)

1. Deceit



- Lying is a form of **deceit** (Psalm 101:7; Pro. 6:16-19). There are many relationships damaged or destroyed everyday because of it.
- Note: Often we can be telling no lies and still be deceitful, so long as we are bearing "false witness"
- (ill: Exo. 8:28-29) Deceitful against one another is bad enough, deceitful against God is even more destructive, both to ourselves and others as well. (Prov. 14:8; 2 Tim. 3:13)

2. Hypocrisy

- Goes hand in hand with deceit, which intends for concealment or to lead people astray. Hypocrisy is to create a false image. (ill. Homework)
- Matt. 2:8) Herod wanted to look honourable
- (John 12:5-6) **Judas** wanted to look caring
- (Acts. 5:1-5) Ananias wanted to look generous
- In each case it did not work out for them. Hypocrisy seldom works. Even if it works temporarily, the person was seeking the wrong outcome.

3. Slander

- Lev. 19:16) Slander can be very destructive as well. (ill. pastor's sister)
- There are so many unhelpful excuses for gossiping...The question we need to ask is this: are we passing judgment? (James 4:11)
- Note: when we gossip, truth or no truth, it is just **foolish** (Prov. 10:18-19). Just stop sharing any shortcoming of anyone (I promise, it won't hurt by stop talking ⊕)



The Father of Lies



- ▶ The world is full of **lies**--often things aren't as they seems
- The world is in the devil's dominance, and he is the father of lies (John 8:44). We are identifying with "the kingdom of darkness" (Col. 1:13-14) when we lie.
- (v.14) How can we be free from this lying world?
 Jesus—He is the truth (John 14:6) and His word is truth (John 17:17). In Him there are no lies (Titus 1:2).
- As we trust in Jesus and study His word, we can **put on** the truth, and we can **put down** our lies (Col. 3:8-9)

What Can We Do?

- James 1:19, 26) **Think** before we speak: are we being deceitful or hypocritical?
- Note: When we do need to share something negative about others, beware of passing judgment—a full disclosure statement may help too
- ▶ (Eph. 4:29-32) Let us **build up** one another with our words. Let us focus on how we may encourage and support one another (Rom. 14:19; 15:2).
